
Stare decisis orizzontale

- Orizzontale: il precedente vincola la stessa Corte che ha pronunciato la sentenza,
- essa dovrà attenersi ai principi che essa stessa ha indicato nelle sentenze precedenti

Stare decisis verticale

- Verticale: le corti di grado inferiore sono obbligate ad attenersi ai precedenti delle corti gerarchicamente superiori.
- Sicuramente la House of Lord prima, e la Supreme Court dal 2009, vincolano tutte le Corti inferiori
- L'unica corte che non è vincolata a precedenti propri o a precedenti di corti di pari grado è la House of Lords e dal 2009 la Supreme Court

High Court


Chancery, Queen's Bench and Family Divisions. All three divisions hear appeals from other courts, as well as "first instance" cases.


High Court and Deputy High Court Judges
